


LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

THAO TANG (Outgoing WCC)






AMANDA DUONG-LE (Outgoing WIG)




never forget the crafts and laughs we all shared together!






LISSETTE TORDERA (Incoming WFD)






NISHAT JAHAN (Incoming WAL)




OSCE PREP NIGHT Written by: David Nguyen

PUMPKIN PATCH & CARVING Written by: Sarah Nakamoto


